

## Code Enforcement Monthly Report for October 2010

### Summary

In October 2010, the Code Enforcement Division continued its efforts to maintain and improve the quality of life throughout the residential and business communities. Over the course of the month, the department **opened 253 new cases, maintained 264 active cases** (previously open and new combined) and **conducted 451 inspections**.

### Activity

- Responded to 25 cases resulting in a violation through the call center
- Investigated 253 violations
  - 123 violations brought to our attention through citizen complaints
  - 130 violations initiated through proactive enforcement
- Conducted 253 initial inspections and 198 follow-up inspections for a total of 451 inspections
- Responded to 100% of complaints within 24 hours
- Inspected 100% of all complaints within 72 hours
- 2010 Compliance rate
  - 100% January 2010
  - 100% February 2010
  - 100% March 2010
  - 99% April 2010
  - 100% May 2010
  - 100% June 2010
  - 100% July 2010
  - 97% August 2010
  - 97% September 2010
  - 91% October 2010
- Cases requiring 3 or more inspections - 0
- Cases beyond 60 days - 4
- Cases beyond 90 days - 1
- Issued 224 Friendly Reminders and Contacts
- Summons and Complaints/Citations issued - 0
- Notice and Demands issued - 0
- Cease and Desists issued - 0
- On average gained voluntary compliance within 13 days of the initial complaint

- Assisted SEMSWA with 3 environmental violations
- Assisted Public Works with 4 streets and infrastructure concerns
- Assisted Tri-County Health with 0 health and welfare concern
- Assisted Building Division with 7 permit concerns
- Assisted Licensing with 9 licensing violations
- Continued teamwork on 4 City improvement committees: Eco Committee, Customer Service Committee, Committee and VIP Committee, LEED Committee

## Budget

Through the tenth month (83%) of the year, Code Enforcement is within budget with accumulated expenditures of \$375,370 (79%) of the 2010 annual budget of \$472, 449. Expense categories are as follows:









### Annual Comparative - Active Cases Current Month











## Violations by District
